## The Student How-To Guide to Voting

### Registration

If you are 18 years old and a US Citizen, you can register to vote in Nebraska.

#### FROM NEBRASKA?

You can stay registered at your parent's house (and vote in person or by mail) or you can update your registration to your school address.

#### OUT OF STATE STUDENT?

You can either stay registered in your home state and vote absentee or you can register and vote in Nebraska at your school address.

**There is no minimum residency requirement, once you move in, you can register!**

### Where to register:

- **Online** - Go to [sos.ne.gov](https://sos.ne.gov) if you have a Nebraska state ID or driver's license
- **By Mail** - Print and fill out a registration form from the Secretary of State's website and mail to your local election office. If it is your first time registering in Nebraska include proof of address and identity, like your driver's license and student bill.
- **In Person, at the DMV, or at your local election office.**

### Absentee Voting

Have a ballot mailed right to your dorm room!

### How to Get an Early Ballot

In Nebraska any person can apply to vote early, you don't need to provide a reason.

Apply for an early ballot by mailing a Vote-By-Mail Request form to the county election office where you are registered.

#### REGISTERED IN NEBRASKA

#### OUT OF STATE

Contact the Secretary of State or election official in the state where you are registered
